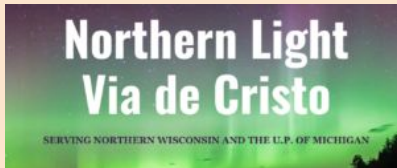

April 21 after fellowship - Sing to the shut-ins.

September 15 - Remembrance Sunday - videos of past years were shown after the worship service.

Members made dishes from recipes collected from old church cookbooks. The church bell was rung for the first time in years. During the service we sang “Lead On, O King Eternal” with the recording made in 1974 for the 100th Anniversary. We also listened to a recording of Mabel Prestrud reciting “The Lord’s Prayer” in Norwegian.

October 13 - Polka Service

November 3 - Special Worship Service. Our church was officially organized on November 26, 1874.

We invited former pastors to join us. A chicken dinner was catered in.
