

How can Jesus be God and Jesus at the same time? This is a good question. The Trinity; God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit; Uncreated, Infinite, Eternal, Almighty. These are some attributes we confess about God. This is from a small portion of the Athanasian Creed. My guess is that we haven't used this creed because it is one and a half pages long.

Philippians 2:5-11. I will write a portion for you beginning at verse 5, "Let the same mind be in you that was in <u>Christ Jesus</u>, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death.

There are three persons but One God. As Philippians states, Christ Jesus became a man and obeyed God the Father. The person of God the Son has two natures; Divine and human. The Divine Son of God took on to himself the nature of a man. Remember the persons of the Trinity remain Father, Son, Holy Spirit. This is the reality of God that he brings to us. In his mysterious and majestic ways the Incarnation of God the Son took on human form. His story is our story. Jesus entered into the world he created to save us. God's ways are beyond our understanding.

Jesus came to us because he had to be a human to fulfill God the Father's Will. Humanity disobeyed God. Romans 5:15-21; to summarize these verses it basically says that the one man, Adam, brought sin into the world but the second Adam, Jesus, brings righteousness which leads to justification, which leads to life. We did not know that without Jesus we would be in eternal wrath forever. Only God can save us. Colossians 1:15-20; (Referring to Jesus) For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

Jesus is the Christ. Christ is a title which means Anointed One, the Messiah. The Apostle Paul writes in II Corinthians 5:16-17; From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything has become new.

What a love story between God and his children. God's gift of each day is filled with his love and kindness. No matter what the day might bring, we know that He walks with us throughout our lives. His promises are true; we are his children and he is our Father. Therefore we can say; *This is the day that the LORD has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it.*

November 3 - Special Worship Service. Our church was officially organized on November 26, 1874. We will invite former pastors to join us. A chicken dinner will be catered in.


Other projects that will be happening during the year:



'Way Back When by Mabel Prestrud

MEMORIES (Originally published in the May 1996 Visitor)

- Mr. and Mrs. Robert Fischer from the Town of Lessor, near Hwy. 47 built a new home in the Village of Navarino.
- Ambrose Landsverk's bout with ruptured appendix - very serious in "those days".
- The Christmas of 1918 there were no programs because of the flu epidemic. Dr. DeCock from Angelica was often called - folks had to go to the Village to a phone to call him. Then his horses Brought him by cutter or buggy.
- Young Folks going to Bible Camp at Onaway Island on the Chain of Lakes, Waupaca. With staff members such as Dr. Hugenvik, Dr. Morris Wee, Rev. Axel Blom and Rev. Hjalmer ("Spike") Hanson to name a few.
- Mrs. John (Caroline) Hegrud said good-bye to her loved ones at Ascension and went to Canada to live with family members there. She was brought back to Ascension for burial. (Carol Hilliker's grandmother)
- The active organization known as "Lutheran Daughters of the Reformation" and the elegant Mother/Daughter Teas they produced every May, preceded by an inspiring program.
- In the early days the pastor took care of filling the chalice with wine before communion. When the Ladies Aid purchased the tray of individual glasses it became the Janitor's job to fill the glasses. Much later an Altar Society was organized.
- Eli Hilliker spent much time and effort beautifying the Ascension Cemetery.
- Pete Blom (he lived in the house where Dedthardt's lived) built the tables for the new basement. They were very heavy and painted white.
- A tarantula was found in a bunch of bananas when Llewellyn's had the store (later Hilliker's store).
- When gas was 7 gallons for \$1.00 in Galesburg!
- Charles Pues and Olga Cornelius married at Jerusalem Church on Valentine's day, 1942.
- The Mork Twins - Royal and Leroy.
- Dawn Christianson and David Prestrud played "God of Our Fathers" on trumpets for Mr. and Mrs. Ben Schuelke's Golden Wedding - a special request from Ben and Gladys.
- Breaking ground for the new church, July 4, 1976. Rev. Steven Larson with hands on plow.


At this point, my daughter looked at me with total admiration and asked, "Mom, how do you know all this stuff, you are so smart."
