





'Way Back When by Mabel Prestrud

Congratulations to Rev. G. *O. Halvorson on his 50th. Anniversary in the Ministry, beginning with Ascension*! Pastor G. O. Halvorson was ordained February 25, 1945 at First English Church(since, the church name has been changed to Trinity) at Stevens Point, Wisconsin. He had grown up in that city. and this was his home church.

He attended Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN, and sang in the Seminary Choir. He was ordained 50 years ago by T. F. Gullixson, who was President of Luther Seminary.

He accepted a call to the Navarino Parish in April, 1945 and was installed at an all day service/celebration at Ascension. That was the time of year the roads in Navarino were <u>very</u> muddy, and the new young pastor experienced them during his first days in the parish.

There was a mimeograph in the parsonage and the pastor was in charge of doing the bulletins each week. When one looks at copies of his Sunday Bulletins we are aware of how different things were "Way Back Then"! Under the heading of all bulletins:

NAVARINO LUTHERAN PARISH

St. John's LutheranJerusalem LutheranNavarino LutheranSt. Mark's Lutheran

The Rev. Gilbert O. Halvorson, pastor

Among these 4 congregations there was an assortment of 3 Hymnbooks. The pastor noted in the bulletins for the 2 churches served on Sunday morning under (1) and (2), also the choral anthems for (1) and (2). The hymns were usually the same tune and words for both service in all books, just a different number, 'tho sometimes he had to change to a different hymn. The service always went on without a "hitch".

An attendance record was kept for each church and reported in the next Sunday's bulletin. Such as shown in one for March 24, 1946: St. John's 37, Navarino 91, Midweek(Lenten) service Jerusalem 37, Navarino 64, March 31-St. Mark's 64, Jerusalem 54, followed with a remark "Watch your attendance!"

One week's announcements went like this:

Navarino and St. Mark's Luther League will meet at Navarino Church. Raymond Christianson is in charge of the program. Topics will be given by Harvey Pues, Mrs. Bernice Svetnicka and Arlene Peterson. Ruth Thompson will lead in devotions. The pastor continues the Bible Study of Genesis. A good attendance is greatly desired. Confirmation class at St. John's at 10:30

Navarino worship at St. Mark's at 9 and Jerusalem at 11 A.M.

Leeman Ladies Aid meets with Mrs. Arthur Olson

St. John's Luther League meets at 8 P.M.

Young people, don't forget Bible Camp begins July 28 and continues until August 4. Among things to bring include a sunny disposition.

We're sure Pastor Halvorson considers his wedding at Ascension June 5, 1947 the highlight of his ministry here. <u>Esther</u>, her sister Clara, and mother, Mrs. Martin Amundson owned and operated the grocery and general store in the heart of the village of Navarino. Pastor Halvorson, being a bachelor, found it very convenient to shop for groceries there after he parked his car across the street to pick up his mail at the Post Office. It was during this time the Amundsons sold the store and moved to Clintonville.

Pastor had calls to make in Clintonville, too, which made it convenient to call on his former storekeepers. Ascension is proud -- the only pastor to ever be married in the church. The church was filled and overflowing. A former Pastor, Axel Blom and a close friend Rev. Alf Romstad performed the late afternoon service. A reception followed in the church parlors. *(Continued on next page)*

It was good having a Pastor's wife in the parsonage again.

In 1948 he resigned to accept a call to Eau Claire. They, along with baby daughter Lusanne would be missed. Folks in the congregation look forward to visits from them, and occasionally having him conduct a service in the absence of the pastor.

He has also served parishes in Chicago and Oshkosh. Has been active on the County Board in Winnebago County, on the City Council in Stevens Point and is now serving as Interim Mayor there. Upon retirement they returned to Stevens Point, to live in the home where he grew up and to be members of the church he had attended 'til he came to Navarino.

Congratulations to the Halvorson's on this important Anniversary, and Thank You for the strength you have given to Ascension.
