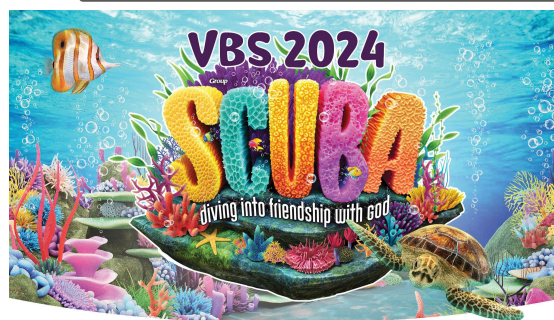

Message from the Pastor ~ Sunday Fellowship



There is terror and despair as we read and watch what is happening in our world. The recent events have caused many to ask; why does God let these things happen? God knows what he is doing. His sovereignty over all things is perfect and true. We are to pray for hearts to be changed. You could say that the world is at war within itself. But Jesus tells us “take courage, I have conquered the world.” (John 16:33).

Jesus teaches us about the futile nature of worrying. In Matthew 6:25-34 you will find that teaching. I want to share the heart of this teaching with you. **Matthew 6:26-30**

Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith?

Distractions cause us to worry about daily events because we are relying on our limited resources. Worry leads to burdens that zap our strength and we become overwhelmed. This kind of worry paralyzes us into inaction or dangerous actions.

Jesus uses humble examples of his creation to apply to his most cherished love; that’s you and me. Jesus tells us to look around and observe the birds of the air. They are free and have no worries. They were not created to harvest crops to provide their own food, and yet they are feed. A bird cannot do the work of a farmer as we do; yet, it is not free from labor, but it does the work for which it was created, namely, it bears its young, feeds them and sings to our God a song for the privilege of doing this. We have all heard birds singing early in the morning the song it has learned. The bird doesn’t worry about where it will find food. When it is hungry, it flies away and finds a “grain of corn,” where God stored one away for it. This is a powerful example and stirs us to trust God more than we do, even during the events of the world that cause pain. Therefore Jesus asks: *“Are not you of much more value than they?”*

Jesus teaches us not to worry about our life. Your life is not yours, nor is your body (Psalm 139: 15-16). He uses another example of the flowers in the field and encourages us not to worry or be anxious. *“The flowers stand there and make us blush and become our teachers. Thank you flowers; you, who are to be devoured by the cows! God has exalted you very highly, that you become our masters and teachers. We must confess that the most insignificant flower, that the cattle tread under foot, should become our teacher.”* **Martin Luther** Jesus goes on to say that King Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like the flowers; lilies, carnations, roses, and yes, dandelions.

What does the subject of worry have to do with the events we are witnessing now? We are called to do the good works that we are created to do in Christ Jesus to glorify our Father in heaven just as the birds and the flowers do what they are created to do. We will find peace in listening to the voice of our heavenly Father. *“This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it!”* In a world that sees despair, God rises up against those who would want to harm us. Do not worry. God’s people are the Apple of His eye. He will protect us from the ultimate carnage that humanity can impose on each other. We were not promised a life without suffering but He promises us Eternal Life where there will be no more pain, death, and crying. There will only be joy in heaven. We receive the peace from God that the world cannot give.

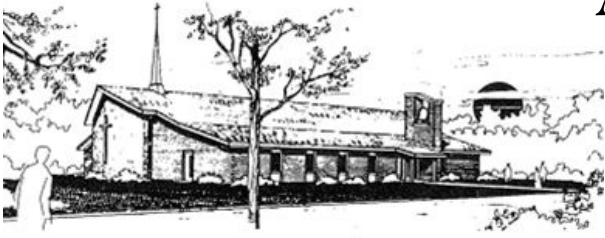
150th Anniversary

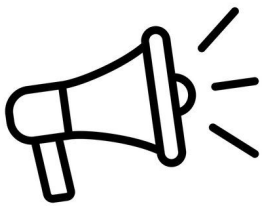

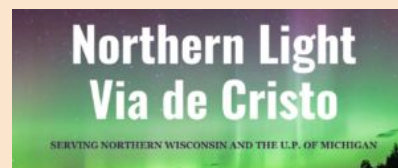

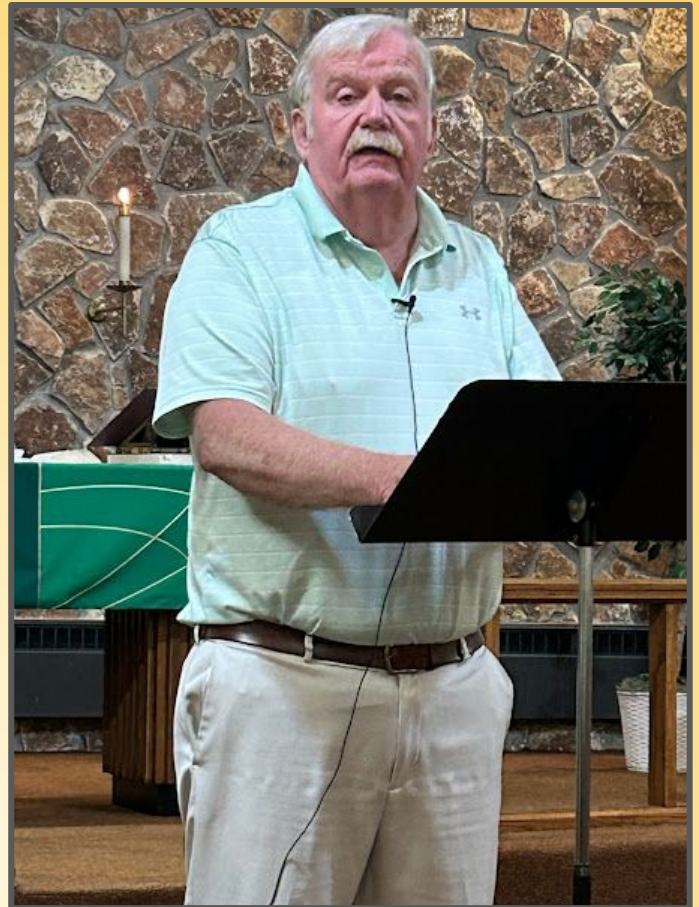

'Way Back When by Mabel Prestrud

From the Past

While looking through old church records to shed some light on cemetery boundary lines, I found an old Ladies Aid record book that was most enlightening. The following are tidbits from that book.

February 1940 - Had an apron sale. Made quilt. Each lady brought 16x20 inch square.

June 1940 - Aid paid \$5.00 for one week's boarding of parochial teacher.

July 1940 - Aid agreed to pay \$10.00 for parochial teacher's salary. Purchased 5 gallons of ice Cream for social for \$4.75.

October 1940 - Paid janitor's salary of \$20.00. Decided to have Norwegian Dinner. Advertising cost \$1.00. Charge for meal 20¢ for children 6-12, 40¢ for adults.

February 1941 - Making plans for an oyster supper.

August 1941 - Bought oilcloth for tables in church basement, total cost 60¢.

Expenses for Norwegian Dinner in 1941:

1 cow	\$65.00	25 lbs pork	\$6.50
Cream	6.50	Milk	.25
Kerosene	.50	Groceries	4.13
Advertising	1.05	Bones	1.00
Butter	2.22	Cigars	.90

Income on same dinner: \$281.70

Sold cowhide for 4.20

Cigars 2.05

Leftover meat 21.25

April 1942 - Bought 50 serving trays for \$5.00.

September 1942 - Paid Rev Evenson \$5.00 for cleaning sewers. Aid paid \$20.00, the balance due on cemetery.

December 1942 - Christmas party, 10¢ gift exchange.

February 1943 - Paid for new linoleum for parsonage kitchen. Cost \$10.38. Paid \$2.00 to August Haefs to lay it.

March 1943 - Each member to bring as many pennies as their waist measurement in inches.

October 1945 - Norwegian Dinner, adults 75¢, children 40¢. Paid \$26.60 for 28 chairs; \$17.00 for 28 more chairs. Basement Day dinner, adults 35¢, children 20¢

December 1945 - Exchange gifts 25¢

From 1945 annual report - The Aid paid for new roofing for the parsonage, \$162.75. Aid paid \$30.00 for baptismal font.

August 1946 - Purchased steam table for \$8.00 from Louisa Christianson.

October 1947 - Norwegian Dinner, \$1.50 for outsiders, \$1.00 for adults members, 50¢ for children.

All during these years the Aid served the lunch at auctions in the area, and there were many auctions.

1953 - Income from fish pond, \$5.25.

1956 - Extra meatballs from Norwegian Dinner sold for 60¢ a quart.

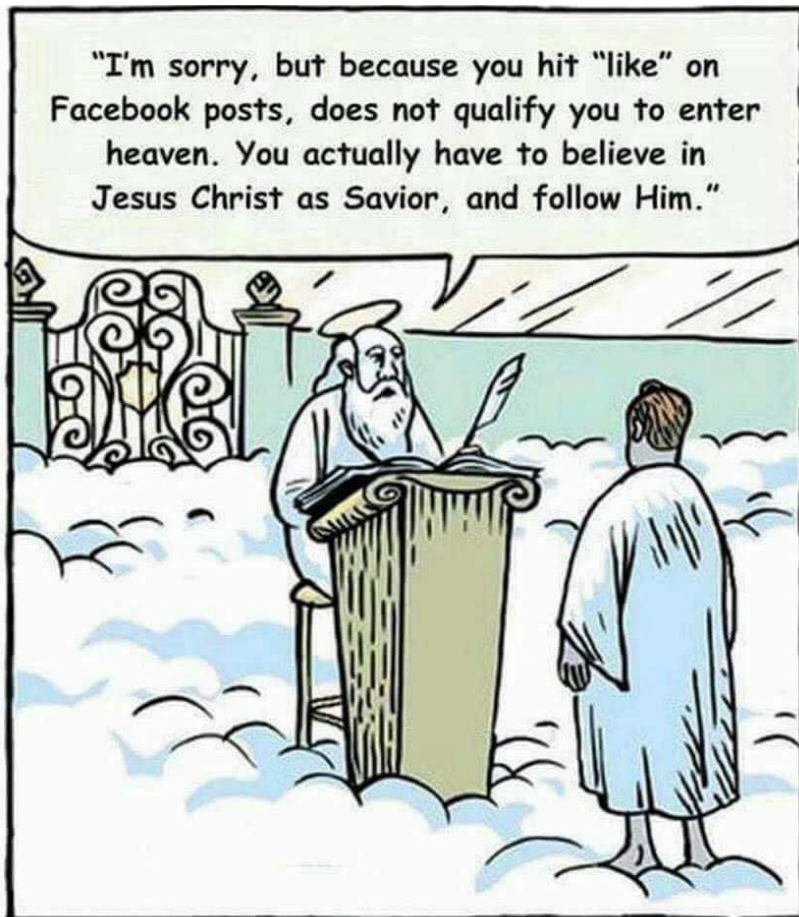
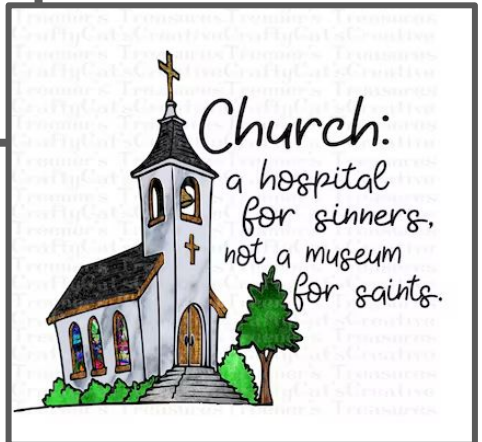
