Message from the Pastor - Learning Opportunities





Valentine's Day was February 14th and Ash Wednesday was the same day. It is rare that these events happen on the same day of the year. Valentine's Day is a day set aside for all loved ones to celebrate. You may go out to a restaurant, buy flowers or a special card, and don't forget the chocolates. There are three definitions of the word "love." Love between a married couple. This kind of love can be intense and extremely personal. You can share anything with your spouse most of the time and not be judged. Mark and I can be intense; just ask anyone in the Tuesday morning Bible Study.

Another definition for "love" is between friends and family. We usually just use the term friend which simply means we enjoy one another's company, and do things like going to the A&W for a root beer float, going to the movies or hanging out as a group of friends. I remember those Friday night dances at the old Elks Club.

The first two usages of the term "love" are conditional. Things can happen in a marriage or between friends. Sometimes these kinds of love are broken and cannot always be mended. The two kinds of love are of a human standard and not Divine. We can ask for forgiveness for hurting or betraying a friend, but we are not absolutely sure if they will forgive.

The third definition of "love" is the Divine love of God. God's love is unconditional and his promises are true and he is faithful. There is not one thing we can do to make God love us more, and there is not one thing we can do to make God love us less. When we come to God for forgiveness we do not have to hope he will forgive, he does.

Ash Wednesday which begins the Lenten Holy season is the one time we as the family of God, prepare our hearts for the ultimate sacrifice of the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world for everyone; past, present and future.

God does not ask us to give up anything for Lent. It is God who gave his only Son in order that we may be saved. When Jesus was hanging on the cross, we were on his mind. The weight of our sin was on his shoulders. As Jesus was dying on the cross, he prayed for us. In the Gospel of Luke 23: 34; Father, forgive them for they do not know what they are doing. Look at the death device of a tree and see Life.


In 2023 Ascension received \$2,183 in Thrivent Choice Dollars grant funding.







This and That

Pepperoni Bread - Submitted by Bonnie Weyers

1 loaf frozen Bread dough –thawed1-8 oz. package sliced mozzarella or provolone cheese

4-6 oz. sliced pepperoni

2 eggs

2 Tablespoons water

½ cup parmesan cheese
1 Tablespoon Parsley Flakes
1 Tablespoons Italian seasoning
1/8 tsp. garlic salt
1/8 tsp pepper



Let dough thaw in the fridge for a couple of days. (I spray a quart freezer bag with pam before putting it inside.) Take out when thawed and roll to an 8' x 18" rectangle (can heat in microwave for 1 minute to roll easier.) Spread with mixture of 1 well beaten egg, parmesan cheese, parsley flakes, Italian seasoning, garlic salt and pepper. I use a fork to spread on the bread. Layer the cheese, then the pepperoni on the bread leaving a little space on the edge. Roll the long edge then connect in a circle and put in an 8 inch round greased cake pan. Pinch ends together. Beat the second egg with the water and brush on top. Sprinkle with Italian seasoning. Cook at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.
